Multiple use means shared use. Sometimes we may not always be happy to share our public land with other users, but cooperation, respect and tolerance are the foundations that make it possible for all users to coexist in a harmonious shared environment. We have never asked that the rights of other users be restricted for our pleasure and hopefully the other users will adopt this same philosophy

One group in particular that I have always felt we had a good relationship with is the livestock grazers. I have even been involved with some cooperative efforts with them in years past. For the most part cattlemen and sheepmen are very pro multiple use. Sadly a few bad apples in the motorized community have started to give all of us a black mark. It is very important that we strive to reassure these folks that we are responsible users of our public lands.

First, respect there facilities. Do not damage ponds, springs, water troughs or any other equipment. Do not harass there livestock.

Most importantly do not cut fences or leave gates open. This is the complaint most often heard from the livestock folks. Please close all gates. If you come to a gate that is open and lying in the road or beside the road, close it. Most times if the gate is meant to be left open it will be pulled back away from the road.

WHEN: Saturday February 23,2008 WHERE: Pothole Road to Bruneau Canyon


WHY: Because we want to HOW: Anyway you can.

We will leave the unloading area and skirt the boundary fence for the bombing range and head over to the overlook on the Bruneau Canyon. If you have never been to the overlook it is quite a view. The canyon is quite deep at this point. There is interpretive signs at the overlook. Everyone please bring a lunch as we are planning on having our lunch break at the overlook. After lunch we will either return about the way we came or continue on around the bombing range depending on weather and the desires of the group. We really would like to have all our new members join us. This should be an easy get the cobwebs out and the rust off kind of ride.



Directions to ride location: From I84 take Exit 114, follow to downtown Hammett. In the center of Hammett turn left on Hy 78 towards Bruneau . Follow Hy 78 along north side of river after the highway crosses the river go about 1 mile. Look for Pothole Road (sign may say Browns Creek) on the left side (There may not be sign but it is the only gravel road going left). (If you go till the hiway turns left you went to far.)
