The little orange SPOT messenger is no bigger than a cell phone but works where cell phones don't. Hit the 9-1-1 button and unlike a regular GPS, SPOT will tell emergency response teams—and your loved ones—exactly where you are. You can also check in with friends and family by hitting the OK button; an email with a Google map of your exact location will be sent to everyone on your preprogrammed list, letting them know you're doing fine. With just four basic communication buttons, there's no fussing to send a message. And at just \$169, this is peace of mind you can't afford not to have.

Just a reminder about the <u>ride buddy system</u>. When riding with a large group it is important that we keep moving and not have anyone get lost. The **ride buddy system** makes this happen. Here is how it works. When approaching an intersection or other place where a rider could go the wrong direction. Stop and wait for the next rider, when you see the rider coming wave at that person when they see you they will wave and you go on and the next person waits for the next rider.

If everyone does there part no one gets lost and we can keep the ride moving. Some times you may have to wait awhile for the next rider, please do not get impatient and go with out waiting. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Please be aware that some Forest and BLM roads are closed at this time of year to avoid damage


UPCOMING RIDES

Avoid sensitive areas such as meadows, lakeshores, wetlands and streams, unless on designated routes.


This protects wildlife habitat and sensitive soils from damage.
