Go Get LOST! - Only Kidding

Very soon, our resident computer expert Aaron Larson will be scheduling a one day GPS lab for our MVATVR members. For those members (like me) that are geographically challenged and missed out on "Homing Pigeon" class in school, this will be a great way to build up your confidence level when using a handheld GPS.

Should you find that you're not able to attend Aaron's class, I have another option you may want to consider. Stock up your car with ample food and water, warm blankets and all the emergency traveling extras you can think of, and head out with your GPS unit into your "local neighborhood." That's right, I'm talking ROAD TRIP! Let's use your GPS to save a track while traveling in a well known location and then use the GPS again to show you the way home. The principle is exactly the same as if you were in the back roads of Idaho and completely clueless on how to find your way back to your vehicle. Are you ready to get lost?

I can't stress enough the importance of first reading your GPS manual to get acquainted with the terms/steps needed to both save a track and start a tracback command. When I describe the steps needed below, the naming protocol and steps I use <u>may be different</u> from what your manual describes. However, if you recently reviewed your manual, it may be easier to interpret the commands you will need to follow. The good news is, should this big adventure fail miserably, your already in a familiar area and will always be able to get back home for dinner.

How to first "Record" a new track:

Select "Main Menu" > "Tracks" > "Setup" >

Set "Track Log" to "On" >

Select "Clear Track Log" before starting each new track. This is a very important step because it will clear the memory of where your last track ended. This will help insure that the new track you are starting will not have any data included from a previous outing.

Now that your GPS is on and the TracBack command is set to record, jump into your car and head out into your neighborhood. After making a 2-3 mile track, stop your journey and "save your track!"

The "Save" feature on your GPS should be found just after you select the "Main Menu" > "Tracks" command. Give your track a name or just accept the default naming (usually a date).

Are You Ready To Start Back Home?

How to initiate a tracBack command from a previously recorded track:

Select "Main Menu" > "Tracks"

Select your previously saved track. A list of saved tracks should now be visible.

Select "tracBack"

- Select Your Point to tracBack to. This is where some GPS units may respond differently. Use your mouse pointer to move to the location of your track where you <u>want to go to</u>. Now hit your enter/select button to select that location.
- Now it should be a matter of just following the path (arrow) shown on the screen. Assuming your GPS has a sound feature, you will also hear a beep just before a turn is about to take place.

Please be VERY careful and pay attention to the traffic while navigating the streets. It would also be helpful to have another person driving the car as you work the GPS unit.

When you have returned home, be sure to select the "Stop Navigation" button.
