MVATVR CLUB RULES & GUIDELINES

The Magic Valley ATV Riders (MVATVR), Inc. would appreciate you being considerate of others and observing the following rules/guidelines while participating in club activities. Obviously, any actions that are unlawful or unsafe are prohibited.

- 1. Pets should be kept on a leash of no longer then 6 feet during any rides, campouts or other MVATVR events. Please be a responsible pet owner and respect the rights of others.
- 2. Idaho State Law states that being under the influence and/or consuming alcohol or illegal drugs while operating an OHV is illegal and therefor will not be tolerated by MVATVR, Inc.
- 3. Generator use should be with consideration for others in camp and a recommended quiet time from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM needs to be observed.
- 4. By operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, waiting at intersections and corners, you can insure that fellow riders will not be left behind and everyone will have an enjoyable ride.
- 5. Being a responsible member means, abiding by state motorized laws and obeying regulations for the area you are riding in, not disturbing wildlife, respecting the land and any private property that is crossed and closing any gates you open.
- 6. Please conduct yourself in a proper manner and strive not to be offensive to anyone, and respect the rights of others.

THERE AND BACK AGAIN ride

Saturday, June 13

Let's do ANOTHER "*There & Back Again*" MVATV Ride. Some members were not able to attend the first seminar, so a second will take place on June 13th.

- * Do you own a tablet or perhaps just thinking of purchasing one? Would you like to learn how to utilize a tablet with the free Avenza PDF Mapping/GPS App to locate your position on the trail?
- * Do you own a GoPro camera and want to learn more about:
 - 1. What a Gopro can do, settings, mounts and general use
 - 2. How to use and share captured Video or Photos
 - 3. Making presentations using both your TABLET and GOPRO together

Are you interested? If so, let's get together for a "short ride." The event will take place (June 13th at 10am) on the north side of the Canyon Rim, east side of Highway 93 (Devils Corral Road/Shoshone Falls Road). To prepare for the ride, have the Avenza PDF Maps App installed on your tablet. Then go into the mapping feature and install the following free maps; Twin Falls and Falls City. Frank Stone will discuss this segment of the seminar. Also, have your GoPro camera charged up and ready to go. David Fait will discuss this segment of the seminar.

This spring time ATV ride will be short on miles (<10 miles) but long in confidence building. We'll discuss the features of the GoPro camera and the Avenza PDF Maps. While on the trail, we'll stop often to take pictures/video, see our track and make waypoints along the way. If you have had any previous reservations about the GoPro camera or safely navigating back to your starting point while on an ATV ride, this little adventure will give you the self-reliance you need to insure you will not only be able to record the day's events with great pictures, but always be able to get safely *There & Back Again*!

UPCOMING RIDES

South Hills, Big Cottonwood Ride

Saturday, June 20, 2015

Aaron and Amy Larson are going on a tour of the South Hills on Saturday, June 20th.

The unloading area will be the Big Cottonwood parking area just north of Oakley. RV camping is available at the unloading area (no water\restrooms) for who wish to arrive early on Friday, or stay and do more riding on Sunday.

From Burley (exit 208), travel through Burley on Highway 27 until you come to 1600 south (a large "Big Cottonwood" sign will be on the right side of the road just before the turn). Turn west and travel 5.5 miles until you come to Mountain Road. Turn north and 400 feet later turn west onto 1600 south for another 1.5 miles to the unloading area. GPS coordinates: N42° 18.253' W114° 01.235'

This ride is for machines 50" or less in width and our ride meeting will be at 9:20 a.m. The ride will be divided up into several legs. For the novices among us, plan on a 60ish mile ride. For those who want more excitement in life, this could stretch into a 100+ mile ride depending on how many detours we take on our travels and if folks don't mind getting back late in the evening.

Leg 1 – Starting at the unloading area, we will travel 24+ miles on a combination of ATV trails, well maintained roads, and roads that I consider "ATV like". We will make one stop to see Big Cottonwood canyon, a quick stop to see an old cabin, and ride slowly past some beaver dams where we will hopefully see some moose. This route is rated a 2 on our scale and is perfect for the beginner rider. We will have one 18 inch deep water crossing that is about 15 yards wide. ATV folks will remain dry if you hold your feet up, Razor folks will get their feet wet! Our destination* is Father and Sons campground where we will eat lunch (restrooms available).

*Leg 1B – Either before or after lunch (depending on the time and how hungry everyone is), we will go on a 9 mile Telephone Canyon loop of the mountains.

Leg 2 – This 19+ mile jaunt will mostly cover well maintained roads and roads that I classify as "ATV like". This route is rated between a 1 and a 2 on our scale. We will have one planned restroom stop on this part of our journey at Basin Patch Spring. This route will offer a view of canyons and scenic vistas of the Magic Valley.

Legs 1 and 2 are designed to keep us off the main roads as much as possible and we will only overlap our route a total of 2 miles. We will now split into two groups. The novices among us will follow Amy on a 7 mile trip down Big Cedar road back to the parking area. Aaron will lead the hardcore riders onto the next part of our journey...

Leg 3 – This will be a 30-50 mile tour of the North Eastern portion of the forest. Mileage will depend on how many people attend and how fast we can travel safely. This section will have a rating of a 4 or 5 on our scale as we go down 079\Robber Gulch. There is one steep section with a somewhat tight turn at the bottom, as well as numerous creek crossings where the road was washed out due to the fire a couple years ago. Due to the recent weather, it may not be in good shape and a pre-ride in the coming weeks will tell me more as we get closer to the ride. We will then make our way to Buckhorn road where we will eventually connect back to Big Cedar road and then hit Robber Peak road and then back down the Cave Canyon trail back to the parking area.

UPCOMING RIDES CLUB RIDE & CAMPOUT

EMIGRATION / SODA SPRINGS NEAR MONTPELLIER, IDAHO AUGUST 15-21. 2015



The club will be riding and camping at Soda Springs/ Montpelier area August 15-21. We have the campground reserved from Sat the 15th at 2:00 PM until Friday the 21st at noon. If you wish to come earlier or stay later you can camp at the snowmobile parking lot located about one half mile from the campground. There will be some led rides. GPX tracks and maps will be provided to go on a self-guided ride.

These trails are technical, with lots of Level 3 & 4. There are some steep climbs on some trails and a strong engine is required. There are some Level 2 roads available to ride if you are not comfortable with the more technical trails. Riding is available for all skill levels but limited for beginners. Trail width limit is 50 inches or less.

Camp ground costs \$5/night. If possible please mail your payment prior to camping to MVATVR, P.O. Box 0767, Twin Falls, ID 83303. This will help us have an idea how many folks are coming to the event. We will be camping at the Emigration group site G3 (this is separate from the Emigration campground).



TRAIL DIFFICULTY GUIDE

Level 1, Beginner:

Gravel or dirt surfaces that are relatively flat and wide. Generally wide enough for an ATV to pass a full-sized vehicle. May be dusty but are relatively smooth with no rocks or roots protruding more than three inches above the surface. Ride distance will be short, speeds very slow.

Level 2, Advanced Beginner:

Mild ups and downs, some narrow, mild rock, mostly roads and jeep trails, minor off camber. Two-wheel drive ok.

Level 3, Intermediate:

Loose gravel, sandy, rocky or rutty surface. May have short sections that are narrow. Can have blind turns, switchbacks, steep or roller coaster grades, some off-camber side hills, minor drop-offs, ruts and frequent changes in riding surfaces. Occasional obstacles may strike the frame. Four-wheel drive may be needed depending on conditions. Pace of ride will be a little faster, distances and length of ride will be longer.

Level 4, Advanced Intermediate:

Rocky surfaces, sharp turns, switchbacks, steep grades, narrow passages, low overhangs, ledges and large rocks. Can be slippery and muddy when wet. May have tree stumps, limbs or other debris. Machines with low ground clearance may strike or high center on obstacles. Four-wheel drive highly recommended.

Level 5, Expert:

Very rocky, steep, off camber, high water crossings, large ruts. Large obstacles in trails, narrow with big drop offs. Four-wheel drive required, may need winch.
