Club Presidents Message April 2016

Now that April is upon us and the weather is beginning to look favorable, it is a good time to be thinking about riding once again. Now is a good time to review some safe riding rules. As you ride be diligent at constantly assessing the ever-changing trail and weather conditions. Never take for granted the trail or weather will never change.

Over the last few years, we have seen an increase in trail users and quick changing weather conditions. While riding, remember loose gravel is different from packed soil. If your machine feels squirrelly, slowly reduce your speed until it feels stable again. Weather plays a significant part in trail conditions. The dusty conditions can make it difficult so see potential obstacles such as potholes, loose piled gravel, and large rocks, just to name a few. Rain can reduce the amount of dust you encounter, but the size of the group you are riding with can cause dusty conditions once again.

When riding in groups be courteous to the slower riders. They too want to enjoy the ride, see the sights, and are part of the group. A relatively small group of experienced riders will definitely ride faster than a larger group. If your trail/route is relatively level, your speed might be somewhat faster with the members staying closer together. Nevertheless, if a trail/route is hilly and/or curvy you will want to travel slower. A larger group of riders increases the possibility to create dusty air. With this increased dust and hazards created by the trail/route geometric it is very important for riders to adjust their following distances to accommodate for these conditions. Dust can build up on your goggles or helmet shield limiting your visibility to see obstacles and other riders. Dusty trail conditions are why the MVATV Riders organization has adapted two methods to help keep riders on the same route (wait/wave and orange cones).

It is very important for both ride leaders and ride participants to observe and follow the guidelines for each of these methods. The ride leader should start each ride with a safety briefing that includes outlining the method used and a brief review of how it is accomplished. It is then the responsibility of each participant to ensure they use that method, keeping the group together on the correct route. Bottom line is that everyone is responsible for keeping the group safe, on the correct route, and on time. Let us enjoy our riding time together, return from each ride safely, and full of new exciting experiences.

Public lands Director Message:

I was fortunate enough to be in Boise for a few days this month. One day was spent at the capitol attending legislative committee hearings. One of the hearings was directly related to OHV's. House bill 553 would allow OHV travel on state highways in cities with speed limits up to 45 mph. We were well represented at this hearing by State ATV president David Claiborne. The bill was passed by both houses of the legislature and is awaiting signature by the Governor. I also attended a very vocal and contentious hearing regarding transfer of federal lands to state control.

I am honored to be a member of the Recreational Trails Projects Grant Committee. I spent two days in Boise at a Grant committee hearing. For those of you not familiar with RTP it is money returned to the states by the Federal Government for gasoline tax that was used for off road. Idaho's share this year was approximately 1.5 million dollars. The grant committee analyzes grant applications and makes recommendations on where the money goes.

We had a situation this month that has me very upset. There is an old saying that Off Highway Users are sometimes they are their own worst enemy. This month that saying came true. Someone, we do not know who, decided to travel on some back country roads that were still quite muddy. Some of the land they traveled on was public and some private. The private land owner has been good enough to allow the public access to his property. He is now upset because of the damage caused by these uncaring individuals. I am quite sure that the folks that did this were not members of our organization, but is still reflects badly on our sport. I would urge to think when you out enjoying the fantastic sport of OHV. 

- 2. Idaho State Law states that being under the influence and/or consuming alcohol or illegal drugs while operating an OHV is illegal and therefor will not be tolerated by MVATVR, Inc.
- 3. Generator use should be with consideration for others in camp and a recommended quiet time from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM needs to be observed.
- 4. By operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, waiting at intersections and corners, you can insure that fellow riders will not be left behind and everyone will have an enjoyable ride.
- 5. Being a responsible member means, abiding by state motorized laws and obeying regulations for the area you are riding in, not disturbing wildlife, respecting the land and any private property that is crossed and closing any gates you open.
- 6. Please conduct yourself in a proper manner and strive not to be offensive to anyone, and respect the rights of others.
