



Seven Club Members received Certificates for Successful Completion of MTDC Chainsaw Training (Units 1-4). The USDA Chain Saw Training Course classroom session took place on Friday April 8, 2022, 12-6 PM at the Twin Falls Fire Department, 345 2nd Avenue East. Instructors included course coordinator, Stewart Schiffler, USDA; Adam Benkula, USDA; Dick Dutcher, USDA, and Jedediah Friedman, USDA.

The 3-part training course includes the classroom session, CPR/First Aid Certification, and field training with the chain saws in order to receive a Chainsaw Certification Card that is good for three years. The ambitious team will head to Burley on April 29, 2022 to attend a six hour CPR/First Aid class.

RIDE REPORT...by Wayne Fischer & Dixie Best

We met at the Gooding Armory at 9:30 and caravanned to the trail head about seven miles Northeast of Gooding. We headed due West and stopped at **Dead Horse Cave** for a quick inspection and then continued West, taking a reverse route the Club did two years ago. A few miles later we were stopped by a very large flock of sheep.

We turned North towards **Bray Lake**. After a short stay at Bray Lake, we followed another route taken seven years ago by the Club going North. We stopped for lunch near the **“Hole in the Wall”**. Then we continued North on the West side of the **“Gooding City of Rocks Wilderness Study Area”** for nine miles.

We then looped back South going through the center of the “Gooding City of Rocks Wilderness Study Area”. We ended up at the “Hole in the Wall” where the trail is somewhat steep and very rocky. After two more stops we headed back to our vehicles. **Total ride was 52 miles.**

We enjoyed the beautiful view, and the warmest day in two to three weeks. The light wind helped minimize the road dust. There was only one minor issue with a starter button problem. Once the ATV started, the driver did not turn off his machine until we got back to the trail head.

We wish to thank Ron Mothershead and Glenn Fischer for some back seat driving directions, as some trails were new. **And a special thanks as well to Glenn Fischer for being the ride sweeper*.**



A sweeper is the person in the rear of the group that would help a fellow rider if anyone had mechanical issues.




LUNCH STOP NEAR “HOLE IN THE WALL”



The Famous Camas Lily Bloom



The famous Camas Lily Bloom starts around late May and continues through mid-June, so take care to time your visit right. Additionally, the swampy marsh attracts a great variety of birds and their offspring, including ducks, mallards, northern pintails, American widgeons, and gadwalls.



Club Rules

The Magic Valley ATV Riders Inc., also referred to as the Club, is expecting your cooperation in adhering to the following rules and guidelines while participating in Club activities.

1. Any actions that are considered unlawful or unsafe are prohibited.

2. Pets should be kept on a leash of no longer than 6 feet during any rides, campouts or other Club events. Please be a responsible pet owner and respect the rights of others.

3. According to Idaho State Law, anyone under the influence and/or consuming alcohol or illegal drugs while operating an OHV will be breaking the law, which will not be tolerated by the Club.

4. Generator use should be in consideration of others at the camp. A recommended quiet time from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM must be observed.

5. Operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, and waiting at intersections and corners will insure that fellow riders are not left behind, and that everyone has an enjoyable ride. Thank you.

Trail Difficulty Guide

Level 1 - Beginner: Gravel or dirt surfaces that are relatively flat and wide, generally wide enough for an ATV to pass a full-sized vehicle. May be dusty but are relatively smooth with no rocks or roots protruding more than three inches above the surface. Ride distance will be short and speeds will be slow.

Level 2 - Advanced Beginner: Mild ups and downs, some narrow, mild rock, mostly roads and jeep trails, minor off camber. Two-wheel drive ok.

Level 3 - Intermediate: Loose gravel, sandy, rocky or rutty surface. Also, May have short sections that are narrow. Trail can have blind turns, switchbacks, steep or roller coaster grades, some off-camber side hills, minor drop-offs, ruts and frequent changes in riding surfaces. Occasional obstacles may strike the frame. Four-wheel drive may be needed depending on conditions. Pace of ride will be a little faster. Distances and length of ride will be longer.

Level 4 - Advanced Intermediate: Rocky surfaces, sharp turns, switchbacks, steep grades, narrow passages, low overhangs, ledges and large rocks. Can be slippery and muddy when wet. The trail may have tree stumps, limbs or other debris. Machines with low ground clearance may strike or high center on obstacles. Four-wheel drive highly recommended.

Level 5 - Expert: Very rocky, steep, off camber, high water crossings, large ruts, and large obstacles in trails. Can be narrow with big drop offs. Four-wheel drive required, may need winch.

I / We have carefully read this agreement and the release of liability and fully understand its contents. I / We are aware that this release of liability is a contract between Magic Valley ATV Riders, Inc. (and its club members) and myself / us and I / we sign it of my / our own free will. My / our signature signifies that I / we have read and agree with this release.

The above and foregoing shall also apply to any minor child of mine accompanying me or participating in the events and activities above-described.
