Elections\Budget\Etc.

At the November meeting we had approximately 45 members in attendance along with a couple that is investigating the club. Sergeant Ken Mencl of the Twin Falls Sheriff's Department spoke to us about law enforcement in the mountains, along with many other things.

At the meeting, a motion was made by Wayne Fisher that the club retain all the current board members In-Lew of going through the motions of having the paper ballots filled out. Glenn Fisher seconded the motion and Gary Aufterheide asked those in attendance to accept the motion. All were in favor with no "No's." As a result, everyone that is currently a member of the Board of Directors will continue as board members during the 2023 year.

At the November board meeting the following week, and after much discussion, the following board members were asked, and are willing to serve in the following capacities: Aaron Larson – President and Newsletter\Website, Robert Leitch – Vice President, Linda Laudert – Secretary and Ride Co-Ordinator, Linda Stimpson – Membership and Treasurer, and Dixie Best – Event Co-Ordinator.

Currently we are unable to take PayPal to renew your memberships. For the time being we

can accept cash or checks. We are looking into the feasibility of using Venmo and\or Zella in the future.

The January banquet planning is going well. The menu will be pork loin provided by the club. The members will be asked to bring salads and side dishes, and the club will provide the desserts. Door prizes are being gathered and we will announce in January what the raffle will be (rest assured there will be at least one raffle geared to the ladies). If you have a raffle prize suggestion, let a board member know! If you would like to donate a prize, or, have a relationship with a local business that might be willing to donate a prize, let us know that as well.

Since we have changed how the website works, you will not be notified automatically of changes to the website. We will, however, try and let you know via email when something important is posted.

The newsletter will generally be posted on the website sometime between the last few days of the month to sometime into the first week of the month depending on the logistics of gathering the information and the creation of the newsletter.

Due to technology issues with your email, if you DO NOT get an email saying the newsletter is posted, check and see if it is on the website. Check your junk mail to see if the notification was sent there, and if all else, please check with Linda Stimpson to make sure the email address that she has for you is current.

Over the years the club membership roster has been in decline and it has affected the income of the club. This year we did not earn any money from working on the trails and in 2023 we hope to return to getting some income for our trail work since the state has the money available.

As part of these things, the board is going to develop a budget, so we have a better idea of how much we spend every year and what our income is.

As part of this process, we are going to create a spreadsheet to categorize our income and expenditures. We will also go back in history and research how much we have spent on past banquets, donations we have made as part of the raffle income, donations to other entities such the Blue Ribbon Coalition, etc.

Once we have a better understanding of our income sources, as well as necessary and optional


expenses, we will determine a reasonable "emergency" fund amount to set aside (the last time we used this was to buy an ad in the newspaper about the seasonal closure changes a few years ago). We may set some aside money for the wind farm situation. We also intend to donate a large amount to the Blue Ribbon Coalition and\or other organizations that support the reason our club was founded as stated in our bylaws.

As we go through this process, we welcome suggestions on how to be fiscally responsible and spend club funds appropriately.

Watch for further details as this tentative date is set in stone as well as the time and location it will be held. As part of this process, we welcome suggestions as to where we can ride and camp.

Trail Difficulty Guide

Level 1 - Beginner: Gravel or dirt surfaces that are relatively flat and wide. Generally wide enough for an ATV to pass a full-sized vehicle. May be dusty but are relatively smooth with no rocks or roots protruding more than three inches above the surface. Ride distance will be short, speeds very slow.

Level 2 - Advanced Beginner: Mild ups and downs, some narrow, mild rock, mostly roads and jeep trails, minor off camber. Two-wheel drive ok.

Level 3 - Intermediate: Loose gravel, sandy, rocky or rutty surface. May have short sections that are narrow. Can have blind turns, switchbacks, steep or roller coaster grades, some off-camber side hills, minor drop-offs, ruts and frequent changes in riding surfaces. Occasional obstacles may strike the frame. Four-wheel drive may be needed depending on conditions. Pace of ride will be a little faster, distances and length of ride will be longer.

Level 4 - Advanced Intermediate: Rocky surfaces, sharp turns, switchbacks, steep grades, narrow passages, low overhangs, ledges and large rocks. Can be slippery and muddy when wet. May have tree stumps, limbs or other debris. Machines with low ground clearance may strike or high center on obstacles. Four-wheel drive highly recommended.

- 2. Idaho State Law states that being under the influence and/or consuming alcohol or illegal drugs while operating an OHV is illegal and therefore will not be tolerated by MVATVR, Inc.
- 3. Generator use should be with consideration for others in camp and a recommended quiet time from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM needs to be observed.
- 4. By operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, waiting at intersections and corners, you can insure that fellow riders will not be left behind and everyone will have an enjoyable ride.
