Please note that Kimberly does not allow pets in their park.





Message from the President

Welcome to September everyone. Hopefully everyone was able to get some riding in even though we did not have anyone host an event in August. Here are some highlights of some important items of note:

Black Mountain Fire

The Black Mountain fire in the South Hills started on Wednesday, September 30th. The fire was started by lightning. The area the fire is in is an area that was going to be part of a controlled burn later this fall. The burn was to be about 3,400 acres in size. As of the time of this writing, the fire is about 1,124 acres in size. They are not actually trying to put the fire out, but to manage it so it burns the area that they had planned on burning. They have 161 people on site, 11 engines, and 2 helicopters. Roads and trails in the area are closed to the public. The 500 road is open, but it may be closed sporadically to move equipment or due to smoke.

2024 Banquet and Picnic

Radios

Once again, I bring up radios. If you don't have one, buy one! Even if you are deaf, and can't hear very good, you should still have one so you can at least get ahold of those ahead of you in the event of a situation in which you might need them to stop and wait.

Last weekend (preface, two friends have purchased Maverick Trails in the last few months) one of my friends wanted to go explore by Wayan, Idaho where he has an elk tag. He hunts using horses and mules and wanted to explore the area more on his new machine. Another friend of this friend thought it sounded good, so Todd, Shane, Kris, Bill and I went exploring. We had a great time until I tipped my Maverick over in a mud hole. I tried going to the side since I navigated it once on the way down the dead end road. On the way back, the rear tire caught the slippery mud and sucked me down into a very deep rut. Over I went on the passenger The group was farther back looking at side. something so I quickly got everyone's attention and they came to the rescue. Nothing was damaged other than my pride! We didn't get a photo of my machine tipped clear over, but here is one after it was mostly winched out.



The same day, a few hours later, in the lead, trying to navigate a very rutted and overgrown with grass road, I received a message that Shane had tipped over. I quickly turned around and found Shane tipped on the driver's side. One of the ruts he was trying to avoid was WAY deeper than it looked due to the tall grass. It sucked him in and over he went. So, consider buying a cheap pair of two way radios from your favorite retailer, and tune it to channel 6.

Trailer Safety

Coming back from Wayan last weekend, we passed a pretty bad crash. A pickup and fairly new toy hauler was laying on its side in the median of the highway. Two ambulances were there, and the life flight helicopter was landing. We don't know the cause of the accident, but it does bring up the subject of trailer safety. Keep your tires inflated properly. Inspect them every time you stop for a break\fuel\etc. Use a weight distribution hitch. Keep your speed appropriate for the conditions at hand.

Trail Etiquette

Trail etiquette – I guess you could say, don't be one of *those* people! There are a lot of things that could be said for this topic, so I encourage you to do some google searches on the topic.

A few small examples are, use hand signals to indicate how many riders are behind you, keep your speed on windy roads and trails in check to avoid a collision, don't litter, non-motorized traffic

Trail Difficulty Guide

Level 1 - Beginner: Gravel or dirt surfaces that are relatively flat and wide. Generally wide enough for an ATV to pass a full-sized vehicle. May be dusty but are relatively smooth with no rocks or roots protruding more than three inches above the surface. Ride distance will be short, speeds very slow.

Level 2 - Advanced Beginner: Mild ups and downs, some narrow, mild rock, mostly roads and jeep trails, minor off camber. Two-wheel drive ok.

Level 3 - Intermediate: Loose gravel, sandy, rocky or rutty surface. May have short sections that are narrow. Can have blind turns, switchbacks, steep or roller coaster grades, some off-camber side hills, minor drop-offs, ruts and frequent changes in riding surfaces. Occasional obstacles may strike the frame. Four-wheel drive may be needed depending on conditions. Pace of ride will be a little faster, distances and length of ride will be longer.

Level 4 - Advanced Intermediate: Rocky surfaces, sharp turns, switchbacks, steep grades, narrow passages, low overhangs, ledges and large rocks. Can be slippery and muddy when wet. May have tree stumps, limbs or other debris. Machines with low ground clearance may strike or high center on obstacles. Four-wheel drive highly recommended.

- 2. Idaho State Law states that being under the influence and/or consuming alcohol or illegal drugs while operating an OHV is illegal and therefore will not be tolerated by MVATVR, Inc.
- 3. Generator use should be with consideration for others in camp and a recommended quiet time from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM needs to be observed.
- 4. By operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, waiting at intersections and corners, you can insure that fellow riders will not be left behind and everyone will have an enjoyable ride.
