Thursday, I, Bill Mefford, and another friend were heading out for a hunting trip and were planning on meeting up with some others at our destination between Mackay and Challis. In the morning, after hooking up the trailer, I discovered that the running lights were not working. I gave Bill a call, and he came much earlier than planned, bought a new trailer cable connector, fuses, and other assorted items and worked on the trailer in the school parking lot. He finished it up just in time to head out. This winter, you might want to go through your trailer and do some basic maintenance that might put a damper on spring camping. Thanks to Bill for saving our hunting trip.

Since I am on the topic of hunting and camping, earlier this summer I bought a new Garmin Montana 700i GPS with built-in Inreach technology. It is basically a GPS with satellite text messaging built into it. On our Caribou Loop trip, I used it to keep Amy aware of where we were and how we were doing since much of the loop had no cell service.

Last night (Saturday) at the time of this writing, we had returned to the trailer and were about to settle down to dinner and a movie when I pulled an updated weather forecast via the satellite. It had changed immensely since we looked at it in Challis at the restaurant on Friday night. After a brief visit with Bill and my friend, we loaded up and headed back home. I got home at 11:00 p.m., and I'm sure Bill got home about 45 minutes later.

This morning, I looked at the cameras for the Willow Creek Summit, and saw the following:



Technology saved us a very horrible drive down the mountain road, and another horrible drive from there, up the summit, and an equally bad Top Cat Summit between Arco and Carey.

I pay for the Safety plan which is \$11.95 a month and I get 10 messages. After that, they are .50 cents each. I also have to pay for the weather forecasts and I think they are .50 cents each as well but I am not sure on those. It also comes with unlimited check in messages. I can basically send Amy a message that says one of the following three things: "I'm checking in. Everything is okay." "I'm starting my trip." "I'm ending my trip."

These work great if I just want her to know we are leaving for the days ride, we have returned, or just that we are OK.

I figured the basic plan was good at first, but now after using it, and sending messages back and forth, I may upgrade to the next plan in the spring when we are doing more riding.

So far, a number of friends have them, and it also works great while hunting in separate groups

since I can send my coordinates to the other guys if we need them to come to our location.

There are ton of other things it can do, like actively let Amy track me in near real time on a map on her computer or phone if I get the next plan.

It obviously lets you send an SOS to Garmin who will contact the closest emergency people in your area should you "press the button."

Also at the meeting last month, we did a written poll. We read the members' comments and will report what most everyone said next month since I have not received the typed list of responses yet. Thanks to everyone for the suggestions and notes of support to the board.

A reminder that quite a few roads in the South Hills are closed for the annual winter closure. Please check your MVUM if you plan on doing any riding in the forest (lol, with this snow?).

Thanks to our young guest author who penned an awesome experience. It is published as submitted.

Now that I am almost done with this article, my leg has been clawed multiple times, my chair has a few scratch marks, and Jean has been giving me her cute little "quit ignoring me and play with me" whine, I have one more thing to add...

Rides are open to current MVATVR members and invited guests.

Trail Difficulty Guide

Evel 1 - Beginner: Gravel or dirt surfaces that are relatively flat and wide. Generally wide enough for an ATV to pass a full-sized vehicle. May be dusty but are relatively smooth with no rocks or roots protruding more than three inches above the surface. Ride distance will be short, speeds very slow.

Level 2 - Advanced Beginner: Mild ups and downs, some narrow, mild rock, mostly roads and jeep trails, minor off camber. Two-wheel drive ok.

Level 3 - Intermediate: Loose gravel, sandy, rocky or rutty surface. May have short sections that are narrow. Can have blind turns, switchbacks, steep or roller coaster grades, some off-camber side hills, minor drop-offs, ruts and frequent changes in riding surfaces. Occasional obstacles may strike the frame. Four-wheel drive may be needed depending on conditions. Pace of ride will be a little faster, distances and length of ride will be longer.

Level 4 - Advanced Intermediate: Rocky surfaces, sharp turns, switchbacks, steep grades, narrow passages, low overhangs, ledges and large rocks. Can be slippery and muddy when wet. May have tree stumps, limbs or other debris. Machines with low ground clearance may strike or high center on obstacles. Four-wheel drive highly recommended.

Level 5 - Expert: Very rocky, steep, off

camber, high water crossings, large ruts. Large obstacles in trails, narrow with big drop offs. Four-wheel drive required, may need winch.



Club Rules

Obviously, any actions that are unlawful or unsafe are prohibited.

1. Pets should be kept on a leash of no longer than 6 feet during any rides, campouts or other MVATVR events. Please be a responsible pet owner and respect the rights of others.

2. Idaho State Law states that being under the influence and/or consuming alcohol or illegal drugs while operating an OHV is illegal and therefore will not be tolerated by MVATVR, Inc.

3. Generator use should be with consideration for others in camp and a recommended quiet time from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM needs to be observed.

4. By operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, waiting at intersections and corners, you can insure that fellow riders will not be left behind and everyone will have an enjoyable ride.
