Hopper Gulch Ride Report

August 24th. Saturday was the first cool day since early summer as compared to the 85+++ temperature days. The forecast was for low to mid 60s which makes it nice for those of us who prefer cooler riding. But the weather person over did it with even cooler temps in the AM. Overall it was still a very enjoyable day for riding.

We had 8 SxS with a total of 15 riders. As planned, we started the ride at 9:30 am and headed south on the Hopper Gulch road, 1/2 mile south of Nat Soo Pah. We took the two east loop roads as we headed south. At 10 miles we headed north towards Wilson Reservoir and once past it, we headed east before heading south again. When we reached the 500 road, we headed west towards the Bear Gulch Campgrounds so we could eat lunch sitting on tables as well as have bathrooms close by.

Before reaching the Bear Gulch Campgrounds we did a short stop at the Hummingbird Feeders. Several of the riders had never been there before. Surprisingly there were still quite a few Hummingbirds. I had expected they would have already been heading south for the winter.

After lunch we took the 500 road west until we reach the Hopper Gulch Road where we headed back towards the trail head. We took the took both east loop roads again rather than the smoother main Hopper Gulch Road since they are more interesting. We all got back to trail head around 3:30 pm safely and without any issues.

Trailer Maintenance

Earlier this summer, Bill and I worked on the trailer brakes on Kris's trailer. Some of the wires were broken going into the hubs. We got it fixed, but given the state of the wiring, I ordered new

brakes. They are here and should hopefully be installed in the next month.

Last month as we were preparing to go on a trip, I noticed the vent cover in the bathroom was letting light in. After looking at it closer, the plastic cover was pretty much sun and heat rotted and falling apart. After inspecting the other two, the one in the garage was also in bad shape, but the one in the bedroom seemed fine until I went up on the roof and found that it was brittle.

I hopped on Amazon and found some much nicer ones, these are made out of aluminum. They showed up, and after watching some YouTube videos, took the inside trim off and after removing the first cover, found the gasket material was also degraded. I went ahead and put all three covers on, and ordered some new gasket material which I put on last week. That wasn't too bad, and with the vent open all the way you could access the gasket pretty easily. Overall the job was pretty easy other than climbing the ladder several times.



Over the years, the trailer frame has started to show surface rust. After doing some looking around, I bought some Fluid Film and have most of the exterior part of the frame coated. I still need to crawl underneath and coat the inside of the frame and the crossmembers but I'll do that when I can park the trailer on some concrete so I can use my creeper to work under it.

Dad also bought some new carpet for the garage part of the trailer. The old carpet was falling apart and leaving the rubber backing all over the place.

Give your trailer a once over and see if there is anything you need to do to yours before winter.

ATV Maintenance

For those that read our Caribou Loop ride report, you saw that Kris had some problems with his machine. Bill and I tore into it, and over two days we did a pile of work.

We removed all the soft brake lines and replaced them, we removed all the calipers and rebuilt them with brand new O rings, put on new brake pads, and also brand new rotors on all four corners. Some "fun" we had was destroying a T40 driver and bolt on the brake rotors since they were red Locktited into place. A torch melted the rest of the Locktite on the rest of them and the job went much smoother. It did require a trip to town for a new bolt though. Also thanks to Berry's Machine Shop (Duane Pearson) for helping remove the destroyed torx recessed bolt really fast.



We also put in a brand new fuel pump to replace the bad one and tore into the engine as well. We did a compression test and one was WAY low, around 90 psi, the other was about 130 psi. We were hoping it was just the valves needing adjustment, and long story short, it was.

We tore the entire back end off the machine to access the engine and after hours and hours of swapping shims and trying to figure out how to get the stupid cams back in, since the directions were wrong, we finally had it back together.

All said and done, the compression is back to a reasonable amount, and it runs great! With nearly 17,000 miles on the odometer, he should be good for another few years of riding before anything major needs to be done again.

Trail Difficulty Guide

Evel 1 - Beginner: Gravel or dirt surfaces that are relatively flat and wide. Generally wide enough for an ATV to pass a full-sized vehicle. May be dusty but are relatively smooth with no rocks or roots protruding more than three inches above the surface. Ride distance will be short, speeds very slow.

Level 2 - Advanced Beginner: Mild ups and downs, some narrow, mild rock, mostly roads and jeep trails, minor off camber. Two-wheel drive ok.

Level 3 - Intermediate: Loose gravel, sandy, rocky or rutty surface. May have short sections that are narrow. Can have blind turns, switchbacks, steep or roller coaster grades, some off-camber side hills, minor drop-offs, ruts and frequent changes in riding surfaces. Occasional obstacles may strike the frame. Four-wheel drive may be needed depending on conditions. Pace of ride will be a little faster, distances and length of ride will be longer.

Level 4 - Advanced Intermediate: Rocky surfaces, sharp turns, switchbacks, steep grades, narrow passages, low overhangs, ledges and large rocks. Can be slippery and muddy when wet. May have tree stumps, limbs or other debris. Machines with low ground clearance may strike or high center on obstacles. Four-wheel drive highly recommended.

Level 5 - Expert: Very rocky, steep, off

camber, high water crossings, large ruts. Large obstacles in trails, narrow with big drop offs. Four-wheel drive required, may need winch.

4. By operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, waiting at intersections and corners, you can insure that fellow riders will not be left behind and everyone will have an enjoyable ride.
